CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

The 2024/25 cricket season was a very special one as the Mount Lawley District Cricket Club celebrated its 100th year as part of the West Australia Cricket Association. The club released a video commemorating the 100-year history with interviews from current and past players, supporters and volunteers. There was also a short book published documenting the club's history. However, the highlight of the season was the 100th Anniversary Dinner held at Crown Perth, attended by 240 guests. A fabulous evening celebrating the club's history along with the selection of the team of the century. A huge thank you to Kerri Enman, Helen Dwyer and everyone else who assisted in arranging the evening.

The club committee decided to have a very strong focus on improving the club's financial and on-field performance, with both having suffered over the previous couple of seasons. I can report that the financial position improved considerably and there were plenty of promising signs with the on-field performances as well.

A huge thank you to club coaches David Virgo, Stewart Walters, Bradley Forbes and Marsh Jackson for their hard work to try and fast track our young club in the right direction. Craig Fewster continued in the role to head up Senior Cricket; with a plan to consolidate what we had started and to continue growth in a young group. We will be looking at what we need to improve on again and who can best assist us in achieving those goals. On reflection there were very positive signs. While we were a little thin in bowling, the senior core again showed that we are not far away from greater success. The support that the senior and junior coaching teams gave to the players throughout the season was exceptional, and every one of them needs to be thanked not only by myself and the committee but every member of the club.

To all the players, we know that it has been tough but your commitment and effort to improve your skills and growth is all we can ask. To all the members, parents and

supporters, thank you for your support, encouragement and understanding as we collectively get through these tough times. However, if history teaches us anything, it is that things can turn around quickly with hard work and application.

Moving onto positives, the off-field side of the club continued to develop and grow and be run in a very professional manner. We have some new faces joining our growing volunteer base and this can only strengthen this great club. In the individual portfolio reports, each sub-committee chair will thank volunteers and individuals for their efforts throughout the year. However, I will say a collective "Thank You" personally for everyone named in those reports and anyone that may have been missed, I apologise.

We have continued to receive outstanding support from the staff at the City of Stirling. Our two Inglewood Ward Councillors (David Lagan and Damien Giudici) and Mayor Mark Irwin have especially provided guidance and assistance to ensure that our needs and requests are responded to in a timely manner. We also get great support from our two local members in state parliament Frank Paolino (MLA) and David Michael (MLA) with anything we need.

We continue to try and improve our club facilities which again ran smoothly this season, with thanks to Helen Dwyer the Facilities Chairperson. Helen's hard work saw great improvement in profitability of the bar and kitchen. Thank you to Steve Castle, who joined the club this season as the Thursday Night cook, sandwich maker and cleaner, and what a great asset he turned out to be.

The quality of the turf wickets improved during the season, with thanks again to Sarah Addison for her outstanding work in trying circumstances. Unfortunately, Turfcare will not be continuing, and we have lost the services of Sarah. The club is currently looking for a new curator and hopefully we have it sorted by the end of the financial year.



The club's finances have continued to improve. We have managed to increase our revenue and reduce our expenditure, which has left us in a great position. Paul Rolf the Finance & Sponsorship Chairperson continued to maintain and grow our finance and sponsorship base. This season Andrew Blythe started on the sponsorship committee but unfortunately, his son stepped away from cricket and Andrew won't have the time to commit next season, but a big thank you to Andrew for his support. Our main sponsors have had very long-term relationships with the club, and we encourage the members to use their services or products. We also welcomed a several new sponsors to the club this season. They have all been acknowledged in the Sponsorship & Finance Report as well as in advertisements throughout this yearbook. We will look at increasing our sponsorship committee and the sponsorship packages we can offer to further build our sponsor base and commitment.

The club's membership and volunteers were again looked after by Kerri Enman. Kerri's effort and workload towards the club as well as trying to watch her boys play cricket at different venues is unbelievable and unrivalled. The club celebrated new playing and membership apparel this season, with everyone commenting on how good it looked. Well done to all involved. We are also looking at the membership packages to encourage more involvement. If you haven't been contacted by Kerri about volunteering, you had better get on the front foot and contact her as she will be in contact shortly.

The Junior Cricket was again handled by Bradley Forbes, who has done an excellent job in getting some great coaches in place and making sure they meet the club and competition requirements. The junior coaching this season has been excellent. It continues to improve as we educate our coaches more and implement the club's development pathway structure. The club will continue to

strive to have two Level A coaches for each grade involved in the junior programs and finally implement the online system that will give players and parents feedback on the players development. Congratulations to David Hawkins and Aaron Petchell and their U13 team who had an outstanding season but lost the Grand Final.

Louise Keohane joined as chairperson of the Communication & Media (Club Secretary). Louise made a great contribution in her first year while learning the ropes. I feel she will be a great asset moving forward. Her willingness to learn and help will attract others to do the same.

Our on-going relationships with our two main stakeholders – City of Stirling and the Western Australian Cricket Association (WACA) – remain very strong. The City of Stirling ensures that our turf facilities and off-field infrastructure are maintained to a high standard. We saw the construction of the fantastic new shade shelter on Breckler 2, with the kids loving it. The WACA runs the Premier Cricket Competitions in a very competent manner and provides various grants to greatly assist our financial viability.

The 2024/25 season had some very positive moments, and we improved slightly again in our performances on-field. Congratulations to Nathan Ellett and the 4th grade team making it through the semifinal round. We need to continue to work as a family to grow the club for the betterment and enjoyment of all. This can only happen by everyone putting their hand up to assist when they can. Hopefully, if we work hard we can meet everyone's expectations and strengthen our off-field presence at the same time as becoming a powerhouse on the field again in the next couple seasons.

Our third grade also won their first round of finals defending 79 runs against Midland Guildford CC. While results are important, what stood out this year was the sense of unity and support around these teams. During the Colts' finals campaign, juniors and seniors rallied together under the scorching sun. For the Under 13s' grand final, more than 40 senior players turned up in full voice under the Hawks tent to cheer them on — a powerful reminder of the pride and connection that exists across the club. And finally, the 4th grade finals, with members going to watch as we attempted to defend 79 runs in 85 over innings.

CRICKET COMMITTEE REPORT

I just want to commence by saying congratulations to the members of the Team of the Century. There have been many great players that have played for Mt Lawley and it would have made the selection process very difficult. You could have easily chosen two teams that would not have looked out of place in the team selected.

We can look back on the 2024/25 season with a fair bit of pride. It's certainly nowhere near where we want to be, but we are certainly starting to see the development across the board. In the 100th year of this great club, we saw the under 13s make a grand final, the Colts and 1st grade play off in very tight quarter finals of the T20s, the under 17s get close to a finals spot, and the 4th grade provided us with a fantastic highlight in their first semi final win.

Yet it didn't start very well for us at a senior level. After five rounds we were 2 wins, 17 losses across the four grades. Not exactly where we wanted to be. Following that the 1st grade finished 5-5 (including 4 of our last 5), 2nd grade 2-8, 3rd grade 6-3 and 4th grade 7-2. It showed great character, excellent coaching and leadership, and the rewards were clearly evident. It provides us with great momentum leading into next season and shows the players that we can beat anyone, and this should be our minimum standard.

I think the 1st grade will now have a clear understanding of what it takes to be a finals team in all competitions. We beat everyone above and below us on the ladder, and ran the eventual winners close in the two times that we played them in the regular season and T20 quarter final. They were very well led by Darius D'Silva and Clint Hinchliffe who both scored heavily throughout the season as well as both being strong contributors with the ball. We saw good support with the bat in stages by all our top order, with Jake Egan, Tyrone Virgo, Elijah Ward- Armstrong, Colin Dwyer, Michael French, Chris Cilemanoff and Tanishk Chethan all

showing that they can play and be successful at the grade. With the ball, Chris Prescott, Phillip Walshaw, Michael French, Jye McDonald and Sean Hayes all contributed with wickets, and put us in positions to win games. The key moving forwards will be the consistency of our group, and the ability for us to all take responsibility. We need to all step up and own our own performance and not leave it to the next person. When we get that right, I assure you that team success will follow.

The 2nd grade season was punctuated again with moments of excellence, but if we are being honest with ourselves, it was disappointing. Like the 1st grade, we need to start taking ownership of our own performance and ensure that we are doing everything that we can to prepare and deliver team success. What we saw, especially in our win's against Fremantle and Gosnells, was that when you score enough runs to be competitive, we have the bowling attack to provide us with opportunities to win games. Unfortunately, too much was left to too few. Stefan Cilemanoff came into the team mid-season and showed what can be done with planning, work rate and not giving away his wicket. His season was highlighted with a wonderful 100 against Gosnells when we found ourselves 6 for 50. Without going into other individuals, our top order at times showed that they can be successful. We just lacked consistency and there was a similarity to our dismissals. We just need to heighten expectations here as the talent is there. But talent is a dirty word if you are not getting the most out of yourself. We had solid contributions in bowling across the board from Coby Perry, Josh Fawcett, Ashton Stampalia, Sean Hayes, Matthew Rossi, Ishant Chopra and Tanishk Chethan. We need to regroup from this, acknowledge it, and strive to get better. As we showed as a club, it doesn't take much to change this.



The 3rd grade were always in games and after Round 5 showed a great desire to be successful and enjoy everyone's individual success.

Collectively we probably lacked runs to provide us with the best opportunities to win games, but our bowlers certainly did their job. James Ward- Armstrong, Cooper Hebbard and Joshua Zelesko all made solid contributions with the bat. Ollie Enman, Aum Patni and Cam Fawcett had strong results with the ball. There were other individual performances at times. We now need to look at raising the bar with our consistency.

The 4th grade had a wonderful season culminating in a fantastic semi final win from the clouds against Midland. Their belief in each other meant that they won close games. They had great energy all year and played to the game plan. It's amazing what can happen when you do. I'm going to mention the top three for each bowling and batting category but acknowledge that everyone contributed to this side. It's what made them fun to watch as everyone played their part. But statistically, with the bat, Eshan Raizada, Even French and James Noble were the top performers for the year, with Eshan scoring a fantastic century in an outright victory that helped put us into the finals. With the ball, Nick Hart took 30 wickets in an outstanding season and was well supported by Nathan Ellett with 26 and James Noble with 22. To illustrate that everyone played their role, Ryan Kaczmarczyk taking 5-22 and Samuel Weston 3-10 in their finals win. When someone needed to step up, someone would.

The 1st grade made it to the quarter finals of the T20 where we ran into a very strong university side. We made a good total which gave us an opportunity to win the game but we were unfortunately run down in the 18th over. We have a team well suited to this format of the game and I'm expecting that we will give this competition a shake over the coming years.

Our Colts side made the quarter finals of the competition off the back of two wins and a close loss in the qualifying rounds. Their quarter final unfortunately was scheduled the day after the 100th year celebration, and we lost in a close one. We had strong contributions across the board here with both bat and ball. We probably left ourselves a little short in the quarter final, but to illustrate the talent of this group, 7 of them played 1st grade this year

The Senior Cricket Committee would like to thank all the supporters, members, volunteers, and past players who continue to support all Mount Lawley teams. The improvement was there for all to see and with this comes greater expectations over the coming years.

To my Senior Cricket Committee, made up of David Virgo, Stewart Walters, Neil Allen and Paul Davis, I thank you for your contribution and commitment to our meetings and your desire to continue to improve the Cricket Club through your ideas and work.

To the grade captains. Darius D'Silva, Mathew Rossi, Fletcher Enman and Nathan Ellett, thanks for all your hard work and leadership. We appreciate your efforts throughout the year and your feedback that only helps make us stronger as a club.

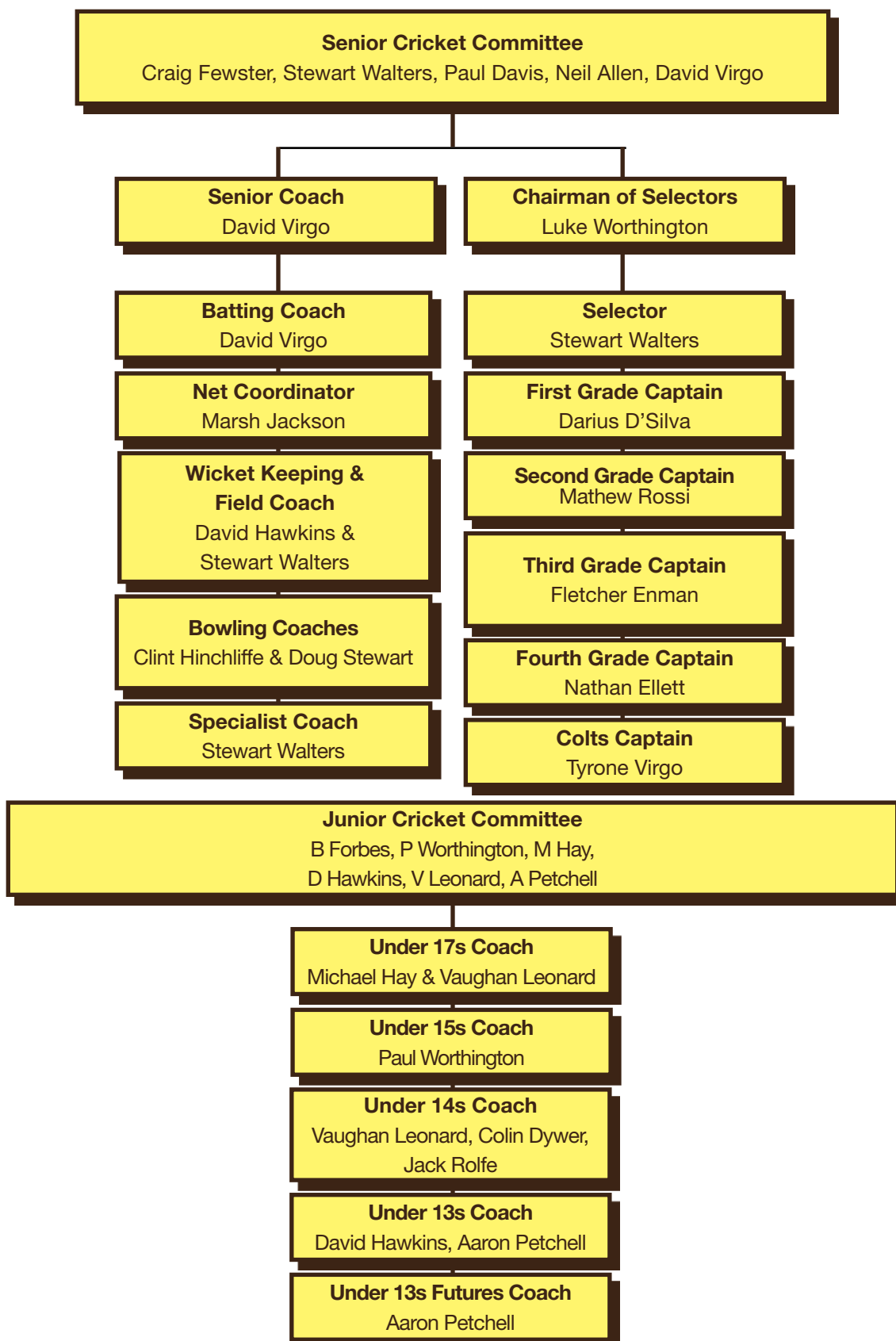

COACH'S REPORT

It was a normal start to the pre-season with an indoor training program for August and September, which included a strength and conditioning program at Inspired Culture in Balcatta for 15 players. Pre-season was well attended and culminated in a couple of T20 scratch matches against Subiaco Floreat and Midland Guildford which were invaluable. Unfortunately Club Captain Darius D'Silva dislocated and fractured a finger in the last game which robbed our A grade of his skills for the first 5 or 6 games.

We went into the season with no expectations as this was our second year on from the mass exodus that robbed us of 10 1st grade players in the 2022/23 season. With Stew Walters guiding our 1st grade on match days, Brad Forbes guiding our 2nds and Marsh Jackson overseeing our 3rd grade we were all looking forward to seeing what the start of the season would present.

The club saw new players join us in Jake Egan, Sam Harris, Joshua Fawcett, Tanishk Chetham and the return of Phil Hennessey (aka Wally). We also welcomed under 17s from last season into the senior ranks. Players such as Nick Hart, Krish Chaudary, Jack Rolfe, Damon Hay, Ishant Chopra.

Armed with a solid yet simple game plan and players ready and willing to get into the season, we unfortunately started poorly as a club and didn't win a game for our first 16 fixtures which was the first 4 weeks of the season. Although we didn't see wins, we did see encouraging performances and good intentions towards the way we wanted to play our cricket.

After the first four weeks our on-field results improved in terms of wins and losses and would see Mt Lawley seniors collectively go on to win 23 games for the rest of the season which included a miraculous and courageous semifinals victory against the eventual 4th grade premiers. To put the wins into context, we as a collective won 18 games for the 2023-24 season.

This didn't include our T20 campaigns in which our seniors and colts teams both made it through to the finals rounds but failing to go past the first final. Nevertheless, it was valuable finals experience we have been constantly striving for.

We were again hampered by players deciding to either leave and play elsewhere, family commitments or deciding that they just didn't want to play cricket anymore. This didn't assist our quest to build our strength and performances on field as nine of these players were playing in our 1st grade and 2nd grade sides. This isn't an excuse but merely an interruption to the club's quest to build its playing depth and strength up year on year.

Our training environment continued to evolve and challenge our players and will continue to evolve. The players grew in the amount of responsibility taken for training standards which will only help us going forwards in to the future.

The off field feel and behaviour around the club also went to another level with some really pleasing social event attendances and most pleasing was the level of senior player attendance at the two Under 13 finals (which included a Grand Final) to watch our baby hawks do battle. This is something I have never seen before at this club and as a club coach this gave me as much satisfaction as winning games of cricket. The Mt Lawley community is growing organically and is being driven by players and volunteers within the club.

Some pleasing performances this season were witnessed within the club. The most pleasing was a century being scored in every grade this season and especially when a century was scored in every grade when we played Gosnells.

Achievements such as our 4th grade making finals was the highlight from a club perspective. Winning all 4 grade games when we played Gosnells was also a highlight. Seeing current Under 17s having big impacts on senior games

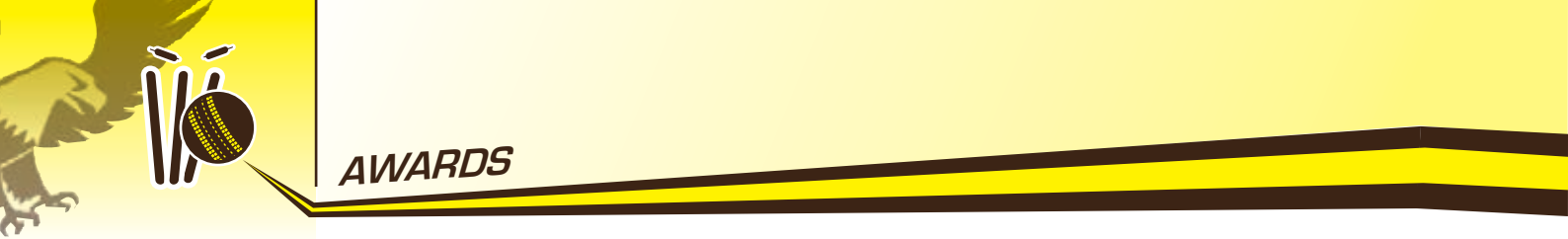

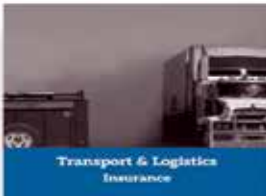

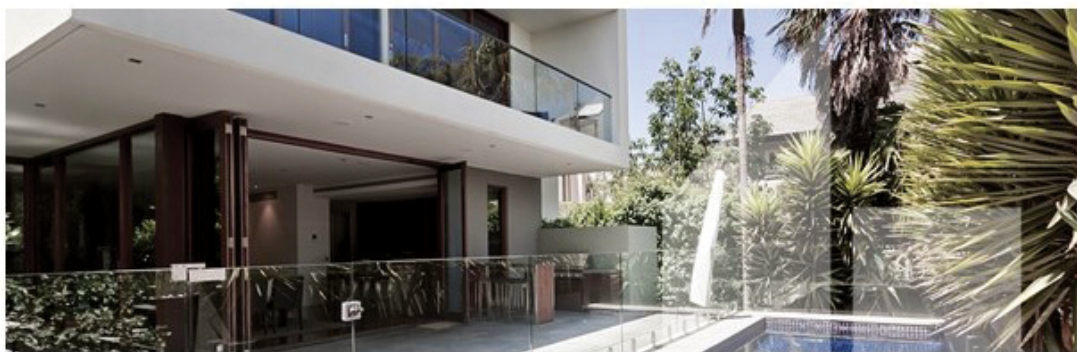

We regularly bowled our way to victory with the likes of Ollie Enman, Aum Patni, Josh Fawcett, Cameron Fawcett and Joshua Zelesco sharing the load the fast-bowling group while James Ward-Armstrong, Tyron Dias and Vasilis Yiannakis contributed regularly as our spinners. The group was regularly able to grind away wickets with six of our eight bowlers taking over 10 wickets for the season at less than 18 runs apiece.

Subiaco and Gosnells, Jake Littleton's 73 in a 127-run win almost outscored Perth alone, and Aadi Sinojiya 1st grade 50 was an earmark of things to come for a talented junior.

We struggled to find our identity as a group through the first five rounds, falling to 0-5, before our developing plans began to click. We proceeded to win six of our next nine games, as well as a draw against midland as we found our groove through the middle of the season. Despite this run, our final standing of 6 wins, 1 draw and 8 losses, would see us miss finals.

I would like to thank the club's coaches, David Virgo, Stewart Walters, Bradley Forbes, Marsh Jackson, our U17 coaches Vaughn Leonard and Mike Hay, for their contributions to the group throughout the year, as well the administration, committee and volunteers that keep the club running as smoothly and successfully as it does.

As we move into next season, I encourage players, administrators and supporters to share the same perspective, have no expectations, trust that the work we are doing is improving each and everyone of us, and as time passes the results will begin to fall our way if we stick to our plans. We all want to play finals and ultimately win a premiership, myself, Marsh Jackson and this playing group believe we can do that.

The under 17s squad had a very strong year, finishing 7th on the ladder and only narrowly missing finals. The team had some fantastic wins and were very competitive during the season.

On reflection, the 2024/25 under 17s squad was a very young group compared to many of our opposition teams. Many of the boys being 15 and 16 years old throughout the season. Notwithstanding this, we were competitive in all our games and won against some of the more favoured clubs.

As a club we always look at the under 17s squad with the view to be competitive, however ultimately challenge the boys, and prepare them to go on and fill important positions within our senior teams. We are proud to say that eight boys from the under 17s played senior grade cricket this year at the club. With five securing their grade spots for either the whole season or the back half.

Success at the under 17s level will only come when the squad, comprising 15, 16 and 17-year-olds come together as a tight knit and integrated group. A group who respects, challenges and pushes one another, and who can celebrate successes together. This year we had an exceptional group of boys who fought hard for their teammates, resulting in good success both on and off the field.

Lucas Hancock was named captain of the under 17s squad for the 2025 season and lead strongly when he wasn't called upon for PSA duties. Darcy Giltrow, Kyan Perera and Jordan Egan all did exceptional jobs at leading the team at other points during the year.

The boys were thrown many challenges this year. Most were asked to take on roles which differed from those they were generally accustomed to. Whether that was opening the batting, bowling death overs in a T20, or forgoing their spot in the under 17s to play seniors. As coaches we really appreciate how the boys took on those challenges and supported one another. Many of the younger boys were thrust into key roles and performed very well.

The boys really got their season started in Round 2, after a rain interrupted defeat in Round 1. A steady 53 off 100 by Jett Guest opening the batting, combined with tight bowling saw us take the first win of the season against Claremont. Round 4 was one of the highlights of the season and saw us take a thrilling win over Scarbrough 118 to 120. Our modest effort with the bat saw us bowled out by a very confident Scarbrough team. Scarborough started the chase slowly but confidently and at 4 for 102 seemed to be cruising to victory. But an outstanding bowling performance from Matt Black (4 for 9 off 10 overs) and one of the catches of the year by Ryker Newman saw us take the last 6 wickets for just 16 runs and take a brilliant victory.

Round 5 saw us take a solid win over Perth, with honourable mentions (Kyan Perera 59 no and Sam Weston 49). Rounds 6 and 7 saw us take on probably the two strongest teams in the competition in Joondalup and Fremantle. Against Joondalup we were competitive, however the competitions leading run scorer was just too good for us on the day and carried his team to victory. Against Fremantle a stellar innings from Lucas Hancock (76 off 122) was not enough to get us past a stacked Fremantle team that was scoring 250 plus each week.

Round 8 was probably one of the more disappointing losses of the season, and in retrospect, probably cost us our spot in the finals. Playing bottom team South Perth in a T20 straight after the Xmas break, and we just didn't get started. A solid innings from Sam Weston (42 off 40) got us to a competitive total of 109. However, our bowlers didn't hit their marks and let South Perth get across the line on the second last ball. It was a good time to reset, refocus and dust off some Christmas cobwebs as we turned our focus to the back half of the year.

Round 9 saw us take a good win over Subiaco. Sam Weston led with the bat (48 off 50), however it was our bowling that was a standout. Aroan Ajayakumar was outstanding in his spell, bowling 4 overs 3 for 9. Which was backed up with 2 late wickets from Aum Patni (3 for 23) which saw us

take a solid win. Round 10, 11, 12 and 13 were all great wins. The Subiaco game seemed to re-energise the boys, and particular the first year the under 17s were gaining in confidence. Against Wanneroo we held our nerve to take a solid win. This win was just a good team effort. Round 11 saw us take on an overconfident Midland team in a T20. Midland set a solid 119. However, the chase lead by Aadi Sinojiya (47 off 42) and Darcy Giltrow (40 off 41) was some of our most exciting cricket of the year. The boys took to Midland's bowling and we were 1 for 100 after only 10 overs. We cruised to victory with almost 2 overs to spare.

Solid wins over Melville (Jett Guest 47, Sam Weston 3 for 26, Aroan Ajayakumar 10 overs 2 for 16) and Gosnells (Aadi Sinojaya 63 off 76 and Sam Weston 46 and 3 for 11) had us sitting in 5th place leading into the final round.

Unfortunately, things didn't go our way in the final round with a comprehensive loss against Bayswater in a T20. If nothing more, this was a valuable lesson to the boys. We beat many teams

this year that were overconfident and this was the first instance, after five straight wins, that we let this creep into our game. A few other results went against us, and we were bumped down to 7th by the tiniest margin and out of the finals.

Overall, the boys had a great season, and I am sure they learnt a huge amount. We want to say a huge thanks to the boys who stepped up and filled senior grade positions during the year. Those efforts haven't gone unnoticed by the club and the senior players.

Finally, a big thank you to the parents, grandparents and families for your support throughout the year. We have a fantastic group of supporters who came along every week to cheer the boys on. The season wouldn't be a success without you all.

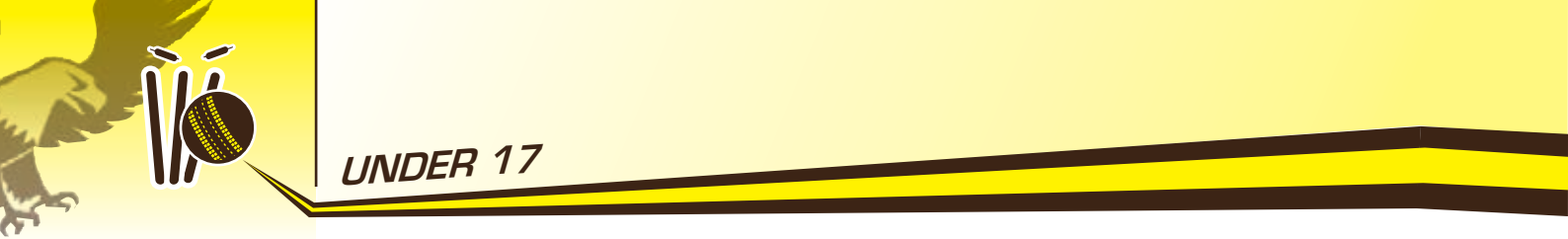

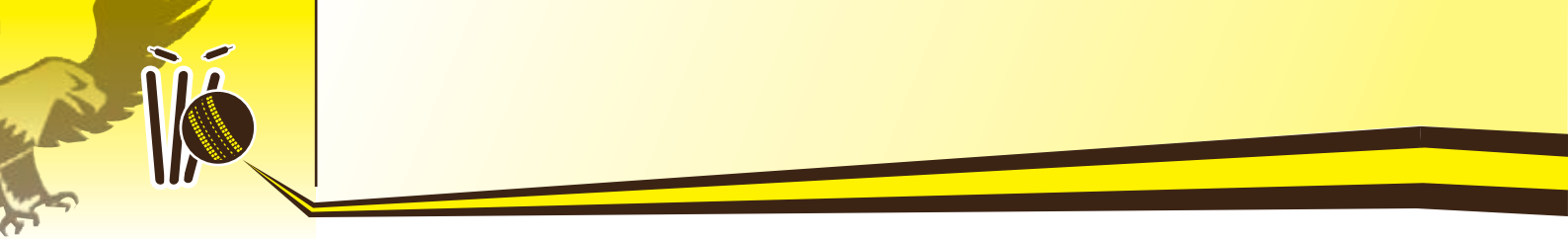

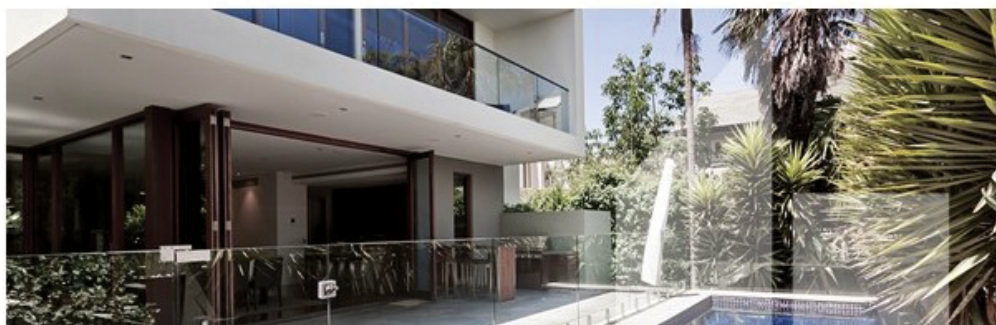

We had a couple of pre-season games against Joondalup and Scarborough where all the boys put in a great effort to come away with two good wins. It made selection for Round 1 hard work.

Round 1 was away against Wanneroo. We batted first with Sachin Bhaskaran scoring 31 and Lachie providing good support. Wanneroo's opening bowlers bowled fairly tight making it hard for us to score, building pressure and creating couple run outs which haunted us most of the season. Thivain Wijayathunga 21 and Diyan Halai 24 had a good partnership which helped us to a modest total of 140.

The under 13s should be proud of what they achieved during the 2024/25 season. The team finished on top of the ladder at the end of the season with 6 wins from the 7 games, with the only loss coming in the last game of the regular season against Scarborough, in a game that we sawed throughout the day.

At the start of the pre-season, we gave the boys the opportunity to establish the team's values that they would train and play by, a task the boys took on with great enthusiasm. The values they set were **Fun and Enjoyment (with respect)** - fun but with a focus, encouraging others, with respect for all teammates, opposition, umpires, coaches and parents, **Effort** - giving 100%, always trying and not giving up and being competitive, **Skill development (and personal growth)** - learning, resilience and being brave, and **Team Improvement** - helping each other, being goal focussed for the team and acts that put the team first.

The team lived up to these values and the results came their way. On the batting side, we had the top two leading runs scorers in the whole under 13s competition, with Samrat Sehrawat scoring 392 runs at an average of 43.56, which is no mean feat considering he faced the first ball in all our innings, with Zack Philips scoring 352 runs at an average of 44.0. We also had another boy in the top 10 leading run scorers, in Aaryan Kanvinde who scored 227 runs at an average of 56.75. Aaryan also took out the Association's batting average award with a batting average of 101.5 runs for the regular season.

On the bowling side, we also had three in the top ten wicket takers in the Association, with Jabir Ahamed in second position with 16 wickets at 12.25, Toby Harris being the third highest wicket taker with 15 wickets at 10.0 and Cooper Chilman with 12 wickets at 12.75.

The first game of the season, saw us playing away at Wanneroo, with Wanneroo sending the boys in to bat first. Our openers, Samrat (74) and Arnav Verma (14) gave us a flying start, with a 50 run opening partnership by the 12th over, with the first wicket falling at 66 in the 17th over. Myles Williams (23) continued the momentum, before Zack (31) and Samrat providing the fireworks with some lusty hitting, each hitting three massive sixes to provide a competitive total of 5 for 188 off our 40 overs. The baton was then handed over to our bowlers, where our opening bowlers taking on the challenge. In a tremendous opening bowling display, Aaryan (3 for 10 off 4 overs) and Cooper (1 for 11 off 4 overs) had the Roos in trouble at 4 for 19. Then the ball was handed to the young guns of the team debuting for the club in Toby Harris (0 for 11 off 5 overs) and Albie Dechitar (0 for 7 off 4 overs) who were unlucky not to take any wickets. The ball was then thrown to another club debutant in Jabir (3 for 14 off 5 overs), whose left arm off spin had the Roos' batsmen in all sorts of trouble, with the team bowling Wanneroo out for 83.

Game 2 was our first home game of the season against Subiaco, with the boys again being sent into bat first. Again, our openers Sam (28) and Aaryan (96*) gave us another 50 run opening partnership within the first ten overs of the game. Sam was unlucky, smashing a ball straight at mid-wicket when looking comfortable at the crease. Myles (57) coming in at 4, continued the onslaught with Aaryan registering a 130 run partnership. Unfortunately for Aaryan he was stranded on 96 not out after our 40 overs, with the team scoring 4 for 218. Once again, not to let the batters take all the glory, our bowlers stamped their authority, with Cooper (2 for 6 off 4 overs) and Mark Black (1 for 10 off 4 overs) having Subi 3 for 12. Myles then wrapped the game up for us taking 3 for 3 off 3.2 overs, to bowl Subi out for 76 and earning Myles the Association's player of the round for his batting and bowling effort.



Game three saw us head up the freeway to take on Joondalup. Again we batted first, but for the first time this season, we were put on the back foot with some great bowling and we were being challenged at 4 for 46 after 19 overs. Zack (59*) and Otis Brescacin (25) then calmly went about restoring the innings building a 66 run partnership through patient batting, great running between the wickets and punishing the bad ball to allow the team to post a total of 7 for 141. With Aaryan and Cooper away playing for WA in the State schoolboy's competition, Toby (2 for 13 off 4 overs) and Mark (1 for 16 off 8 overs) took on the new ball responsibilities to the same effect, having Joondalup 3 for 21. They were then well supported by Albie (0 for 15 off 6 overs), Jabir (3 for 21 off 6 overs) and Alistair Cosby (1 for 14 off 4 overs) to help bowl Joondalup out for 105.

Game 4 was back at home against Bayswater-Morley, with our opponents sending us in to bat first again. Samrat (86) once again provided us with a foundation from which to build upon with a temperament I haven't seen in such a young batsmen. This time he was supported by Otis (34 runs) with a 65 run partnership, before then being joined by Zack (33) which saw the balls flying to all parts of the ground. Cooper (15) and Giuseppe Di Martino (16*) then also piled on quick runs to get the team to a total of 7 for 218 off our 40 overs. For the first time, our bowlers were being challenged with wickets being hard to come by, with Bayswater at 2-114 off 27 overs. At this stage, the ball was thrown back to our opening bowlers, Mark (1 for 19 off 8 overs) and Cooper (4 for 38 off 8 overs) and the boys didn't disappoint with Mark dismissing their opening batsmen and highest run scorer, before Cooper then taking 3 wickets in one over to turn the game our way. Toby Harris then cleaned up the tail taking 4 for 9 off 4.3 overs to bowl Baysie out for 148.

Game 5 was at home against Centurions, with the first time this season we were asked to bowl first. Our opening bowlers, Aaryan (0 for

17 off 7 overs) and Cooper (3 for 14 off 7.5 overs) were unlucky not to take any wickets in their opening spell and Centurions were 2 for 44 off 18 overs, when the ball was thrown to Henry Petchell making his debut for the club in an U13s game. Henry (2 for 20 off six overs) then put on a leg spin masterclass and was unlucky to have a number of other chances go to ground, with Centurions being bowled out for 94. Samrat (67 of 61 balls) and Arnav then got us off to a quick start to get to 27 off 7 overs before our first wicket, before Zack (69 off 63 balls) joined Sammy for a 116 run partnership at a rate of more than a run a ball, with both boys hitting twelve 4s each. When they both fell within the space of two overs, it was then up to Aaryan (49* of 55 balls) to steady the ship and once again he ran out of balls to reach another milestone, with the boys posting a total of 6 for 248 off their 40 overs.

The next game was again at home against Midland-Guildford, with Midland choosing to bat first. Midland posted a total of 9 for 158, with Toby (3 for 18 off 7 overs) and Jabir (3 for 31 off 7 overs) the pick of the bowlers. Chasing the highest total scored against us this season, it was important our openers to get us off with a good start. Samrat (47) and Aaryan (44) did not disappoint with an opening stand of 80 off 15 overs. Zack (33 off 32 balls) continued with his great form with the bat to get us past their score, with the final score being 7 for 180.

Our last game of the regular season, saw us going into the game undefeated against Scarborough. Winning the toss we chose to bat first, with Sam (24) and Zack (50) again getting the team a 50 run opening partnership. After Zack was unfortunately caught on the boundary with a rocket hit straight to deep mid off, the runs dried up via some great leg spin bowling and the boys not adapting to the very slow outfield, before Giuseppe and Cooper put in some late hitting to get us to a total of 144 runs. Our opening bowlers, Aaryan and Toby bowled well without much luck with Scarborough



reaching 3 for 101 after 26 overs. Our spinners, Henry and Jabir then slowed the run rate down, and with a couple of quick wickets we were back in the game with Scarborough being 6 for 135 off 37 overs. Unfortunately, we were unable to get the necessary wickets and Scarborough passed our total in the 39th over, posting a final score of 7 for 153.

Despite the loss, the boys finished on top of the table and hosted the semi-final against Melville at Breckler. Melville won the toss and elected to bat first. A great opening spell by Aaryan (1 for 17 off 8 overs) and Toby (2 for 20 off 7 overs) had Melville 3 for 9 after 8 overs. Then the batting pair of Oscar Hussey (51*) and Harrison Cox (45) dug in deep to allow Melville to post a total of 4 for 134. We didn't get off to a great start with the bat losing an early wicket, before Samrat (34) and Myles (19) steadied the ship to have us at 2 for 51 off 15 overs. Zack (21) looked at ease at the crease before being caught with a sharp catch hitting it straight back at the bowler and a flurry of wickets saw us going from 3 to 83 to 6 for 97. The nerves started getting to the boys and we were soon 8 for 122 in the 35th over. Fortunately, we had Cooper, who batted confidently and with Jabir at the other end, we went past Melville at 9-135 off 39.1 overs and we were off to the Grand Final.

The Grand Final was played at Hillcrest against Scarborough, with the boys winning the toss and electing to bat first. Samrat (21) and Aaryan (22) got us off to a good start, with Myles then contributing 17 runs. To have us sitting at 3 for 81 off 25 overs. Zack complied 46 runs off 55 balls and was looking well set before finding a fielder in the deep to be dismissed. Giuseppe (27) and Cooper (14) allowed us to post a defendable total of 7 for 176 off our 40 overs. Scarborough came out attacking and we were unable to take some of the chances provided before Toby had one of their openers caught well by Otis. The game was slipping away from the boys with Scarborough at 1 for 87 off 16 overs, before the ball was thrown to Jabir who took a wicket in his first over.

Whilst it would have been great to win the final, I cannot have been prouder on how the boys performed this year. They are a talented group of boys, and I look forward to watching their cricketing journeys continue.

Then Otis and Jabir worked in tandem to slow the runs and with a couple of quick wickets, including a great stumping by Zack, the game was there for the taking. At the 30 over mark, Scarborough was 4 for 142. In the 32nd over, with Aaryan bowling, three quick wickets fell, to have Scarborough at 7 for 148 and the game was back in the balance. Unfortunately, the boys were unable to take any further wickets and Scarborough passed our total in the 38th over.

I would like to thank George Hackling and Emma Harris for providing their team manager's support to the coaches throughout the year and for all the parents for their assistance and support throughout the season.

A larger contributor to the team this year and for its success is Aaron Petchell. I cannot thank you enough for your assistance, counsel, words of wisdom and support provided to the extended U13s and futures squad.

Whilst it would have been great to win the final, I cannot have been prouder on how the boys performed this year. They are a talented group of boys, and I look forward to watching their cricketing journeys continue. They lived their team values throughout the season and always had smiles on their faces playing the game in the right spirit.
