But as we approached the AGM in August 2022, things started to change very dramatically and I felt I needed to stay to assist the club get through this over the next couple seasons and be able to celebrate 100 years of existence the following season with style.

As everyone is now aware the Mount Lawley District Cricket Club was decimated leading into last season when eight of 2021–22 One Day Grand Final team decided to retire or play cricket elsewhere. This was a huge blow to the club not only on field but also off. It was too late to recruit players, but with the support of club coaches David Virgo, Stewart Walters, Bradley Forbes and the new/yet to be appointed Cricket Committee Chairperson; we set the plan in place to manage the very young and inexperienced playing group on a pathway for a rebuild.

As we all know where there is pain and tragedy there is opportunity. We had a very young and inexperienced playing group and all the teams worked extremely hard throughout the season with very little success. But on reflection there were very positive signs and great leadership all throughout the season. The support that the coaching team Senior and Junior gave to the players throughout the season was exceptional and everyone of them needs to be thanked not only by myself and the committee but every member of the club.

To all the players, we know that a lot of you were forced to play a grade or two above where your current skill sets/growth is at; but the club thanks you for your efforts all season under very challenging conditions, you can all hold your heads up high, for never giving in.

Finally, to all the members, parents and supporters, thank you for your support, encouragement and understanding as we collectively get through possibly one of the toughest phases of the club's history.

Moving onto positives the off-field side of the club continued to develop and grow, as it is run in a very professional manner. We have some new faces joining our growing volunteer base and this can only strengthen this great club. In the individual portfolio reports each committee chair will thank volunteers and individuals for their efforts throughout the year, I will say a collective "Thank You" personally for everyone named in those reports and anyone that may have been missed, I apologise.

We have continued to receive outstanding support from the staff at the City of Stirling. Our two Inglewood Ward Councillors (Bianca Sandri and David Lagan) who provide guidance and assistance to ensure that our needs and requests are responded to in a timely manner. We also get great support from our two local members in parliament Simon Millman (MLA) and David Michael (MLA) with anything we need.

We continue to try and improve our club facilities which again ran smoothly this season, thanks to Michelle Reid the Facilities Chairperson. The quality of the turf wickets has dropped away over the last season or two, which has been disappointing. The club has already addressed the turf management situation by renegotiating an agreement, that will bring a fully qualified turf wicket curator to Breckler Park and incentives to raise the pitch ratings back to where they were two years ago or beyond.

The club's finances have continued in the positive nature lead by Paul Rolfe the Finance & Sponsorship Chairperson as we continue to maintain and grow our finance and sponsorship base.



Many of our sponsors have had very long-term relationships with the club and we encourage the members to utilise their services or products. Welcome to the new sponsors we had join the club this season and they have all been covered in the Sponsorship & Finance Report as well as advertisements throughout this yearbook.

The club's membership and volunteers are looked after by Kerri Enman. Words cannot describe the effort and time Kerri commits to the club as well as trying to watch her boys play cricket at different venues. The club is reviewing the playing and membership apparel during the offseason with a possible new look. We are also looking at the membership packages to encourage more involvement and if you haven't been contacted by Kerri about volunteering, you had better get on the front foot and contact her.

Our Senior Cricket program this season saw Craig Fewster return to the club as chairperson. Craig took a little while to assess the lay of the land, but by the end of the season we could already see the positives of being able to get him to return home. Craig has already started looking at next season and things are already looking very positive and news will be distributed as they unfold.

The Junior Cricket was again handled by Ross Broun who has done a great job over the last couple seasons, Ross has indicated that he will not be continuing as his son will be moving into senior cricket. The junior coaching this season has been fantastic and it will only continue to improve as we educate our coaches more and implement our development pathway structure. As of next season we will probably be the only club in the competition that will have four level 2 coaches involved in their junior programs and an online system that will give players & parents feedback on the players development.

John Mirco continued in the role as Chairperson of Communications & Media. This has seen our online presence grow slightly but communication with the WACA has also improved. There will be a huge push next season for our online administration to change from the MyCricket platform to Play-HQ, this will also see a new webpage, increased social media presence and match day photography.

Our on-going relationships with our two main stakeholders – the City of Stirling and the Western Australian Cricket Association remain very strong. The City ensures that our turf facilities and off-field infrastructures are maintained to a high standard. The WACA runs our Premier Cricket Competitions in a very competent manner and provides various grants to greatly assist our financial viability.

Unfortunately, this season saw us lose some more greats of our club, Trevor Bidstrup, Frank O'Driscoll, along with Colin Tyler's wife Wendy. Condolences to all the families of the loved ones we have lost and we are thinking of you all.

The 2022–23 season has been the most challenging I have been involved with in my 30+ years at the club. But it has also been a very rewarding experience to see the passion and commitment from the playing group, coaches, volunteers and members to make this a better club. Hopefully we can meet everyone's expectations and strengthen our off field presence but become a powerhouse on the field again in the next couple seasons.

Ninety-eight down, only one more season until the club will celebrate a milestone that other clubs will envy. Looking forward to reaching the 100 club.

All the best for the winter, stay safe and see you all back bigger and better for the 2023–24 season.

I want to start with an apology from myself regarding my access and direct communication with the senior playing group. I was drafted into the role of Head of Senior Cricket just prior to the season starting, and with this, and the fact that I haven't had any direct involvement with the club in 20 years, I wanted to do three things.

1. Observe all four grades and all players and see where we were at as a Club.
2. Develop a Cricket Committee where there was freedom to speak freely and openly about our program, any concerns, investigate all ideas, and ensure that the process was mapped and presented to the Management Committee
3. Look at what we need ongoing as a senior group for the future.

What I can assure you is that all levels of the Committees that I run and serve have the best interests of the playing and coaching group at hand and are always looking for best practice.

What I can also assure you is that next season I will be more transparent, continue to look for ways to make the playing experience better, and open to anyone to come up to me and discuss any concerns or ideas that they may have. We will be looking to introduce a player's representative/advocate that can present formal ideas from the players to the Cricket Committee for discussion at all levels. We want this club to be progressive and rewarding to all that are a part of it. The committees are made up of ex-Hawk players, as well as a number of remarkable people who love this club and are fantastic at what they do. So, we should all be unified in how we look moving forwards.

What we do know about the 2022–23 Season was that it was one of great challenges. From the moment that I accepted my role, we proceeded to lose 8 of our 2021-22 One Day Final side. To lose that many Senior Cricketers from First Grade creates enormous challenges right through the Grades.

With this we were only able to win 8 games throughout the Senior Grades for the season. Looking at the faces representing us week to week across the grades, in comparison to our opposition, we were very young, but never lacking in enthusiasm. With that, expectations needed to be realistic. It never meant that we weren't good enough. It just meant that a lot of players were being asked to perform at a level that you probably weren't sure if you were at.

The First Grade presented themselves in a professional manner throughout the season. One win against Gosnells was a great highlight, but there were many games that the team fought hard against their opposition to ensure that they were made to play at their best to secure the win. Chris Prescott was outstanding all season and his 29 wickets at 24 showed his great value to the club as a strike bowler. Michael French, Alex Osborne and Liam Ward- Armstrong all worked hard for wickets.

It would be fair to say that the runs per over were too high for the season, and with this, further pressure went onto the batting. From the batting side, there was promising signs at different times, but getting it to happen in the same innings was a continuous issue. Muhammad Ashfaq showed that batting in the top order wasn't beyond him. Same with Elijah Ward-Armstrong, Braydon Fernandes, Tyler Scroop, Ben Dale and Tyrone Virgo. All had top order 50s or thereabouts. The upside is that you have all now seen what the competition at this level looks like. What the good teams do. Batting time while remaining positive.

Bowling good areas that force errors. Batting and bowling in partnerships. The learning experience will be invaluable. But it will now take more than just an understanding to go to another level. It will take work. Experience playing the level is very different to being able to consistently perform at the level. But that gap will close if you are prepared to work.



What I can assure you is that all levels of the Committees that I run and serve have the best interests of the playing and coaching group at hand and are always looking for best practice. The Second Grade had a season of almosts and what ifs. Too many times we were either right in the game or in front of the game, without pressing home the advantage and taking the points. This will come with belief, with confidence in each other, and with hard work again. Taking that catch, taking a run out opportunity. As you all saw, they matter, and the good teams make them count. There were some excellent individual batting performances but again very few in the same game.

Notable exceptions were the matches against Rockingham-Mandurah, University and Scarborough where we were able to bat well as a unit and put together totals that had us in, or in front of the game for a long time. The bowling was capably led by Joe Jackson and Simon Douglas, along with Jye McDonald. Jye was a great story. I watched him bowl in his first match in Fourth Grade. Like so many of our squad, he has talent, and he backed that with performance, straight into Second Grade, and then leading into a First Grade debut. It shows how quickly a season can change individually.

The Third Grade were great value for money all year. They were competitive. Colin Dwyer scored our only Senior Club century for the season as he belted 109. Luke Worthington was always consistent. Matthew French showed great application in his two innings for two 50s and showed what he is capable of at higher levels. Coby Perry, Jamie Lucking and Vasilie Yiannakis were consistent wicket takers with all of them getting Second Grade opportunities at times. Cameron Fawcett showed later in the season his wicket taking value. But it was a team effort and I have left out a lot of names here who all contributed to a solid season.

The Fourth Grade were well led by James Noble both with bat and ball, who continued to show great on field leadership. It is often a revolving door at Fourth Grade level, but there were many strong contributors with bat and ball, that again needed more consistency. The Fourth Grade were in a lot of games, especially the One Day fixtures, and as a club, we need to get better at closing out opportunities.

Our Colts went winless despite solid performances against Scarborough and the Country 11, the former which we really should have won. Again, the lack of runs hurt us in two of the games. Tyrone Virgo led the batting with Coby Perry and Cameron Fawcett the bowling. We need to get the economy rates down again in the bowling and have a more consistent batting performance to move into the final stages next season.

As a club, we need to start setting goals for next season individually and collectively. We are working to recruit some players into the club that will assist us moving forwards. But we do not want to close off pathways that are now open. That being said, it is up to every player in the club to look at their season. What you did well? What didn't you? Did you train well? Did you present yourself on game day in the best way possible? We drew a line in the sand to start the season. And there is an opportunity to move forwards to grow quickly individually and collectively.

Thanks to Kerri Enman for her work with both Senior and Junior teams to ensure that the players have the equipment and apparel that they need.



The preseason started off in August as per usual with a preseason program mapped out as we have done the last couple of preseasons.

This meant Stewart Walters and myself rolled up the sleeves and got to work with our very young and inexperienced group to make the most of the opportunities that were presenting themselves to everyone in the club. Friday morning's training was the most rewarding block of training in our three years of its existence due to the eagerness of the group to take on any challenge given and their desire to learn as much as possible from the knowledge and experiences passed onto them by Stewart Walters.

Monday night training sessions were also very well attended and welcomed some new players plus some juniors coming into our senior system for the upcoming season.

As we progressed through the season all grades played their hearts out and with a spirit that we expect from Mount Lawley cricketers and weren't embarrassed or disgraced in any sense. In fact throughout the season we gained respect from the clubs that played against us, given the cards we were dealt.

Throughout the season we witnessed some wonderful performances that probably wouldn't get a mention at the Ollie Cooley medal count or go down in history as memorable however it did show us we have a very bright future in years to come.

Players fighting for their team and batting against State level bowlers to hold them out for most of a day of tough unrelenting grade cricket. Batters batting for lengthy periods of time to set up batters for later on in the innings and allowing for some good team wins. Some very good bowling performances and young bowlers acquitting themselves really well in grade cricket.

In the wins and losses columns we failed miserably but the season was by no means a loss and by no means did we walk away from the season as losers. The First Grade managed to win one game and pushed South Perth to the last ball in a nail biting affair. The Second Grade didn't win a game but lost a handful of games due to their execution of basic skills rather than them not being good enough. The Third Grade were our stand out performers in terms of wins and our Fourth Grade won a couple of games while having 44 players represent them this season. Lots of these players being from our Under 17s.

The learnings and exposure our players received throughout the season, that a lot of them would not have received so early in their cricket lives, can only serve them well in the future. Not once did I hear of any complaints or excuses of it all being too much. It was head down and tails up all year in a bid to learn, grow and be better every week. In essence we learn how to lose together and stay united throughout that process. This will make us better and more gracious winners when it becomes our time to shine.

Some individuals do demand a mention and I will cover them but I must reiterate, the whole club mentality throughout this season has been the standout to me as Club Coach. This was highlighted in the last game of 2022 in which our club and Bayswater played for the O'Neil - O'Driscoll Cup. The most wins by the club on the day determines the winner of the cup. As our 15s, 17s Fourth Grade and Third Grade won their matches, Mount Lawley won the cup for this season.



The celebrations that night were as grand and loud as I've ever seen or heard and were greater than any premierships I have been involved in at Mount Lawley. Driven purely by our enthusiastic youngsters getting into the whole club mentality and enjoying each other's success.

No club would ever have the courage to deliberately remove 7 or 8 of their last season's First Grade grand final representatives and nor should they but I feel in years to come we will see how beneficial this event was for the growth and success of the Mount Lawley Cricket Club as a whole.

Jye McDonald who played Under 17s last season, started in Fourth Grade and worked his way into our First Grade side and got a taste of what it takes to be a First Grade bowler. He was also selected, along with Tyrone Virgo to play in an Under 18s trial match and attend their training sessions in preparation for a potential State Under 19s training squad inclusion for this upcoming season.

Elijah Ward-Armstrong joining us from Bayswater-Morley showed some glimpses of what he has to offer and won the First Grade batting award. Something he should be very proud of and wouldn't of had that opportunity in his previous cricket existence.

Chris Prescott for putting his hand up to captain the club when everybody else wanted out of the place. His willingness to stick fat in tough times was something I will always remember and honour. On top of his leadership under extreme pressure he bowled as well as anyone in the competition this season. It showed us he still has some good First Grade cricket left in him.

Michael French for his leadership under extreme pressure was unbelievable and showed us all what a tremendous person we have at our club. His lack of experience as a First Grade cricketer didn't stop him being

Michelle Reid and Paul Tomerini for their wonderful player's tea meals provided on selection nights and the wide array of food available on match days. Kerri Enman for her work ensuring we never had a player out of uniform, loading teams onto MyCricket and helping with Frogbox duties and many other things. People don't realise how much time and effort she puts in to make our club work as it does. Brendan Reid and the committee for their support and backing I have been afforded. Brendan also works tirelessly to make Mount Lawley as good as it can be and must also be recognised for his tireless and unrewarded efforts.

Thanks for all the support our members and supporters have given this season and I look forward to seeing you again next season to see the further development and growth in our playing group for season 2023-24.

Coach's Report on District Under 17s

The U17s squad had a very successful year. At this level we measure the squads performance not only by the games that we won, but by the contribution the boys make to the senior club. In pre-season it became evident that the seniors would need players from the U17s almost every week, and many of the boys would go on to fill important positions within those senior teams. As coaches, our focus this year was to fast track and develop as many boys for senior cricket as we could. We are really proud to say that 11 boys from the U17s played senior grade cricket this year at the club, with a few cementing their spots in different grades for the year.

Success at the U17s level will only come where the squad, which comprises 15, 16 and 17 year olds comes together as a tight knit, integrated group. A group who respect, challenge and push one another, and who can celebrate successes together. This year we had an exceptional group of boys, and the way they came together as a team was really impressive.

Kodi Giltrow, Culzean Spence and Ryan Kaczmarczyk all captained games this year and were asked to share the captain responsibility. All did exceptional jobs at leading the team.

The boys were thrown many challenges this year. Most were asked to take on roles which differed from those they were generally accustomed too. Whether that was opening the batting, bowling death overs in a T20, or forgoing their spot in U17s to play seniors. As coaches we really appreciate how the boys took on those challenges and supported one another. Many of the younger boys were thrust into key roles and performed very well.

We started the season with a strong win against Wanneroo in Round 1. We were sent into bat and battled hard to set a competitive total of 154. The game was won however with some exceptional bowling and fielding. Ollie Enman received a WACA player of the round nomination

for his 5 for 13 off 10 overs. Supported well by Kodi Giltrow with 3 for 43 from 10 overs.

We had a disappointing loss to Subiaco-Floreat in Round 2, however bounced back strongly against South Perth in Round 3. In a shortened weather effected game, we were sent into bat. Ishant Chopra belted an unbeaten 76* off 67 balls and was well supported by Culzean Spence (32) to set a total of 2 for 136 (26 overs). Again, our bowling and fielding (8 catches) was exceptional and we were able to contain South Perth to 126 (S Hayes 2 for 22, J Leonard 3 for 16, I Chopra 3 for 15).

We took on Perth in Round 4 and Rockingham in Round 5. In both games the toss unfortunately went against us, with Perth having far better batting conditions and taking an easy win. Rockingham then chose to bat out the only overs not impacted by rain for an uneventful draw.

We rebounded strongly in Rounds 6 and 7 taking wins over Gosnells and Bayswater. The win over archrivals Bayswater helping the club to take back the O'Driscoll-O'Neill Cup. We had several solid contributions over these two rounds (R Kaczmarczyk 51, M Kesavan 59*) but again it was primarily the fielding and bowling that won these games. At the Christmas break we were well positioned at 5th on the ladder.

Unfortunately, with boys working hard in U17s and many also playing senior cricket, injuries started to creep in. This also coincided with many boys enjoying extended family holidays given the travel restrictions imposed over the past few years. While this gave opportunities to others in the squad, we were somewhat under gunned in our fast bowling leading into the back half of the year.

We started the new year with a hard-fought win over Joondalup. This game was a really gritty win by the boys. We started strongly with the bat (C Spence 45) then lost a few wickets in quick succession. A late partnership between



D Hay (32) and Ean Broun (22) got us back on track and set a competitive total of 9 for 182. We turned to our spinners (K Giltrow, E Broun, J Rolfe and N Hart) to share the bulk of the bowling load. With all bowling very tight spells and sharing among the wickets.

The next two rounds saw us taking on top of the ladder Midland-Guildford, and the second place Willetton in T20s. We pushed Midland to the very last over for a narrow loss, however, were easily beaten by Willetton. In both games our batsman struggled with the T20 format, getting relative slow starts and putting too much pressure on the lower order in the later overs.

In Round 11 we took on the eventual premiers Scarborough. On a hot 40 degree plus day, our bowlers struggled and the boys lost focus in the field letting Scarborough pile on late runs and set up a total of 5 for 248. With a big score to chase, the boys took to it confidently and were well on track to chase down the score. Unfortunately, we lost key wickets at the wrong time, and left too much to the tail. Great starts by I Chorpa (42) and K Giltrow (40) just couldn't be converted into match winning innings. An admiral effort by the tail (J Rolfe 22 off 12, S Hayes 13 off 8 and O Enman 8 off 5) saw us push Scarborough hard, but ultimately fall just short.

We had a disappointing loss to Melville in Round 12, where a win would have almost cemented a finals spot. While our bowlers struggled to contain one of the premier batsman in the competition, I think it was a game we learnt a lot about patience when batting and sticking to a plan when bowling. C Spence (46) and M Kevasan (57) both batted well, however lacked support, with us falling short by 37 runs.

Round 13 against Fremantle saw us with only a slight possibility of making finals. We needed to have a strong win and have other results fall our way. Fremantle simply played their home ground to advantage. They batted patiently and took advantage of a short boundary, hitting 26

boundaries in their 50 overs. A highlight for us was Harry Basoli's 4 for 37 after him missing a good chunk of the season through injury. Set 225 to win, we had a number of boys get starts (I Chopra 32, D Hay 28, K Chaundhary 20, D Gleeson 20) however none were able to go on to a match winning innings.

The final round of the season saw us up against the grand final runner ups Centurions in a T20. This has become a bit of a grudge match for us, with some good battles over the past few years and some good healthy competition. Having now missed finals, we selected most of the older U17s boys to have one last game together before they graduate to senior cricket. The boys were fired up and while we set a modest total of 8 for 88 (K Chaundhary 27), the boys ripped through the Centurions batting line up. Excellent bowling and strong fielding (6 catches) meant the task was too great for the opposition. Excellent spells by O Enman (3 for 11) and E Broun (3 for 13) saw us take a solid win.

Overall, the boys had a great season, and I am sure they learnt a huge amount. We want to say a huge thanks to the boys who stepped up and filled senior grade positions during the year, in what was a tough year for the senior club. Those efforts haven't gone unnoticed by the club and the senior players.

Finally, a big thank you to the parents, grandparents and families for your support throughout the year. We have a fantastic group of supporters who came along every week to cheer the boys on. The season wouldn't be a success without you all.

Coach's Report on District Under 15s

Coming into the pre-season, I heard a lot about this new look group of Under 15s. Many new faces and 2 current players as coaches (Matthew French and Koby Jackson).

As a group, we identified our captain (Jack Clarey) and vice-captain (Blake Arnold) who both did a very good job. The boys and us as coaches were keen to start the season.

The boys were thrown a challenge early; set their goals for the year; tell the coaches what they thought their strengths were. While the pre-season lack of turf wasn't ideal, the fielding drills and fitness set the team up well for the season ahead.

It's fair to say the boys found it difficult early on making the transition from Under 14s to 15s and the team were well beaten in the first 6 games of the season. Coach's Report on District Under 14s

To say the Under 14s season was anything short of a success would be an understatement for such a commitment group of young men. The boys were challenged to improve on past seasons results and create a team culture that demonstrates the spirit of cricket to its fullest, all while developing their cricketing capabilities.

The players were keen to build on the momentum generated from last season and with a solid preseason under their belt, the energy and enthusiasm was evident at the onset.

Round one saw us play a determined Midland-Guildford where both sides were looking to get off to a winning start. A fantastic partnership of 127 runs between Sam Weston and Daniel McFarlane and our miserly co-captain Sunny Pradhan spell was enough to guide us through and start the season on the front foot.

A wash-out in the following round placed even greater emphasis on the coming results due to the limited games the age group plays.

Round three presented us with a tough challenge against a much-improved Joondalup. While we were in a winning position at 0/40 chasing 170, it proved a stretch too far. It was pleasing to see opener Billy Strang hit 57* well supported by Will Blythe and Keshav Tewari with the ball.

A few weeks off between rounds three and four provided an opportunity for us to reset, calibrate our thoughts and continue the development journey. The coming-of-age performance was the next round against Scarborough away from home. In a similar position to the previous game, we were again chasing 150 to win. This time, having learnt the lessons and gaining invaluable experience from being exposed to this situation before, the boys held their composure and showed maturity beyond what we be expected of them to get the result. Players such as Josh Hawkins and Rafael Ivanac stood up in critical moments, capped off by a sensational 82* by Sam Weston.

With all to play for in the final round, it was great to be back at home against Wanneroo. A clinical display in all three facets of the game saw us take the points comfortably. Sam Weston and Kyan Perera both passed 50, with Billy Strang continuing his hot form opening the batting. Our spinners in Matthew Black and Keshav Tewari played pivotal roles backed up by all players who showed high levels of concentration and willingness in the field. It was fantastic to see the player smiling and enjoying their cricket in this game, playing for one another and the badge.

To finish third and miss out by one place on finals in a testament to the commitment of our players to learn and grow, along with a cricketing program that stacks up with the rest of the competition.

Coach's Report on District Under 13s

The 2022–23 season was a departure from the previous season in that both the U13s and futures squads trained together all year with those boys not selected for the main squad game each week playing futures. We also had a co-coaching structure with both of us working together in charge of both futures and U13s games.

The focus this season was on the boys having fun while developing their cricket skills, becoming better cricketers and people as well as enjoying team success. The start of the season feels so long ago now but we had a number of pre-season training sessions commencing in early August focussing on fundamental cricket skills as well as three warm up games against Centurions (synthetic wicket) and two turf games at Breckler Park against Subiaco-Floreat and Wanneroo. All the boys were given opportunities to have a superior preparation and vie for selection for the season opener against Midland-Guildford.

U13s Team Composition

We had a fantastic group of boys this season who bonded very well and displayed great camaraderie. The U13s main squad primarily consisted of Lukas Charsley, Sachin Bhaskaran, Henry Clarey, Thomas Carlos, Aastik Vats, Sam Keys, Henry Scholz, Kai Denham, Will Petchell, Harry Day, Taksheel Kadri, Kanishkh Menon and Josh Stott who played 4 or more games this season. We also had a few boys Nicky Heng, Aaryan Kanvinde, James Clocherty and Jonah Cumming play some main squad games throughout the season after performing consistently well in the futures team.

The season started with so much promise and excitement given how talented a squad we had assembled which contained several returning second year U13s players as well as new recruits from our local community feeder clubs. Prior to the Christmas break, we had four games where we ended up having a resounding win against Bayswater-Morley (R4), losing two closely contested games against Midland-Guildford (R1) and Centurions (R3) with the R2 game against Joondalup being washed out.

Highlights from First Half

The season opener against Midland-Guildford included Lukas Charsley taking 3-6 off 3 overs, Tom Carlos 2-13 of 5 overs and Kanishkh Menon scoring 39 which ended up a much closer game than the scoreboard suggested. We ended up a few runs short and weren't able to dismiss their two most experienced state squad players early enough with the additional 45 extras not helping our cause!

Although disappointed with the result the season moved on with consecutive away games against Joondalup (washed out) and Centurions at Iluka. The boys did amazingly well to dismiss Centurions for 121 after they were 3-94 with Sachin Bhaskaran picking up 5-20 of 6 overs and Harry Day 2-13 of 4 overs. All the boys bowled and fielded well with great intensity and spirit and the belief was there we could knock over the eventual semi-finalist. Unfortunately, when we batted, our boys tried very hard but had difficulty adapting to playing forward and straight on an extremely low bouncing and deteriorating pitch. After being 1/26 we were bundled out for 80 with only Tom Carlos, Taksheel Kadri, Sam Keys and Will Petchell showing any major resistance.

The R4 game against Bayswater-Morley was memorable as it produced a commanding batting display from the boys which was in keeping with their true ability. Notable performances with the bat from Aastik Vats who hit 50 of 49 balls with eight boundaries, Henry Scholz with an impressive 49 of 74 balls in his first game of the season. We missed Henry's presence in the top order for the first 3 games – hopefully he doesn't go skiing before the start of next season!

It was also pleasing to see Henry Clarey smash 32 of 17 balls in a commanding performance towards the end of the innings. Although Henry didn't quite have the season, he expected he did exceedingly well captaining the team with Tom Carlos and the other boys in the leadership group.



Post Christmas Break

After the break we had three remaining fixtures to be played over consecutive Sundays in late January/early February, all of which we had to win to make finals. The R5 game against the top team Subiaco-Floreat was a heart-breaking affair. Having won the toss and batting first we were all out for a disappointing 108, with a last wicket partnership of 31 between Josh Stott and Will Petchell giving the team a fighting chance! The boys showed amazing fight and the bowlers rose to the challenge with some inspired bowling from Lukas Charsley 4-18 of 6 overs and Sachin Bhaskaran 3-11 of 4 overs to have Subiaco-Floreat reeling at 5 for 46 and 7-87. However, despite the magnificent effort of the boys we just couldn't get over the line! The opposition coach commented to me how well our boys had bowled and fielded that day and they probably didn't realise how close they were to beating the top team when they were 5/46!

Although it was a tough pill to swallow, we truly believe the boys moving up to U14s next season will reflect on this game and realise how good they are and that they just need to continue to seize the big moments in games as well as not resting on their laurels and performing consistently, especially the batting side.

The undoubted highlight of the year was the R6 game against Scarborough where both the U13s and U14s side comfortably won at Abbett Park, which we haven't done for a very long time! Although some common sense didn't prevail with the umpiring, which restricted our innings to 37 overs due to compulsory extra drinks breaks mandated by the WACA, the team piled on 6/149 with Tom Carlos opening and hitting a mature 46 in his best batting performance of the season and Josh Stott hitting a quick fire 38 no off 27 balls at the end. All the bowlers performed well as a collective unit, with Kai Denham and Tom Carlos exceptional opening the bowling which placed significant pressure on the opposition who were restricted to 8-131.

The singing of the team song by both junior sides while a Scarborough life members function was a real highlight!

The final R7 game against Wanneroo was notable for the spin twins Henry Scholz and Henry Clarey bowling in tandem combining for 5 wickets while helping the team get through its overs! Unfortunately, we had an indifferent batting performance chasing and probably left ourselves with too much to do at the back end of the innings.

A big thanks to Tom Carlos, Henry Clarey and Henry Scholz for undertaking the captaincy duties. This season we made a conscious effort to let the leadership group captain and take charge of field placements and give them some latitude with bowling changes, although I'm still getting over the two Henry's being spin twins and getting 5 wickets between them while helping the team get through its overs. We finished the season with two wins, one draw and four losses including two very close losses to the two semi-finalists from our group.

Well done to all the boys who won awards this season – Tom Carlos (batting), Aastik Vats (fielding), Lukas Charsley (bowling), Sachin Bhaskaran (champion cricketer) & Will Petchell (Coaches' award). Congratulations to Lukas Charsley and Sachin Bhaskaran for also finishing in the top 10 WACA bowling aggregates.

This group of boys are highly talented and I fully expect some of them to be pushing for inclusion in state development squads in the next few years. We have no doubt that sustained personal and team success is just around the corner and that most if not all of the boys will graduate to playing senior cricket in five years. Thank you to all the boys for their contributions this season and we all look forward to them backing themselves and playing confident, fearless and aggressive cricket in 2023–24 and beyond!



Frank O'Driscoll

It was a very sad day in the history of the Mount Lawley District Cricket Club when Frank O'Driscoll died on 29 September 2022.

Frank was an icon of our club with his involvement expanding over sixty years as a Player, Selector and Senior Administrator.

During his First Grade career Frank played with many fine players. He captained our First Grade team that included a young Terry Jenner and Ashley Mallet – who both went on to play for Australia.

Frank joined the club Management Committee shortly after he finished his playing career in the role of Vice President.
